### Principal's Piece

One of the things I love about being in education is all the different learning and community activities that happen across the year.

Tomorrow, Saturday 25/5, our parents and staff will be manning the BBQ at Bunnings in Shepparton. Please take some time to drop in, say hello and buy a sausage to support the work of our P&F group.

Over the past 2 weeks, we have been completing the NAPLAN assessments. There has been significant media attention on the technical difficulties faced by schools. I am pleased to report that our school had a very smooth run through the NAPLAN assessments. With the exception of some very short service interruptions on the first session, the assessments have run without a hitch. NAPLAN is a great tool for evaluating the learning of our young people, but is always taken as one of many tools we use to keep a track and inform both the development of our young people and the development of our school practices. NAPLAN results are generally not released until the middle of Term 3 at the earliest. Well done to all our students on the effort they have put in to the NAPLAN assessments.

We now move to mid-year tests for our year 7-8 students, and exams for year 9-11 students. These are scheduled for the first week in June. If you have young people in these levels, please assist them in revising and preparing for these assessments.

I am pleased to report that our under 12 Soccer team has now won 4 out of 4 games. What is more pleasing is watching both the great sportsmanship they have shown and the ongoing development of their skills and teamwork over time.

Preparation of our school production is well underway, with students auditioning for roles in the primary and secondary part for this production. Rehearsals and preparations for the production will be ramping up as we approach Term 3, with the performance

## SRC Keep Me Warm Campaign

During assembly this week, the students were introduced to a new initiative we are supporting called the "Keep Me Warm" campaign. Our school is looking to assist the Shepparton animal shelter in its work of caring for lost animals and those that are waiting to find a new home. Last year the shelter looked after 803 dogs and 1427 cats and they would greatly appreciate any assistance we can offer them to continue their valuable work.

We are asking our school community to donate any of the following items:

- Blankets
- Towels
- Sheets
- Pet beds
- Toys
- Laundry detergent
- Doonas
- Face washers
- Pillow cases
- Kitty litter
- Treats and pet food

The shelter uses blankets on beds in winter, and sheeting for beds in summer. Pillowcases are useful as they are quite a good size for the cat cages in particular. Beds in both cat and dog cages are usually changed every day therefore donations of washing powder would be gratefully received.

The shelter is also in need of toys suitable for cats or dogs. There are outdoor yards where the dogs exercise and play and they also have toys in their pens to help keep them from becoming bored. There is also a cat play area. Toys don't last forever, so any donations are gratefully accepted.

Finally, the shelter goes through a great deal of food. They would be happy to receive puppy and kitten food, food for adults as well as food for senior animals. They feed them both dry and canned food. The only brand they can't accept is Black and Gold due to problems in the past.

All items can be brought into the school office by Friday 24<sup>th</sup> June, after which time we will organise for them to be delivered to the shelter. We would like to thank you in advance for supporting this campaign in whatever way you can.

### **WHO CAN USE THE SCHOOL DENTAL SERVICE (SDS)?**

- All primary school children in grades prep to six
- All children enrolled in Special or Special Development Schools
- Children in years seven to twelve whose parents hold a current
- Concession or Health Care Card
  - All children aged 2-17 years of age eligible for the Child Dental Benefit Schedule (Funded by Medicare)

### **WHAT TYPE OF CARE IS OFFERED?**

- Examinations (check ups)
- Treatment, including:
  - Dental sealants to prevent decay
  - Application of fluoride
  - Fillings
  - X-rays
  - Extractions

### **WHO PROVIDES THE TREATMENT?**

- All general treatment is provided by Dental Therapists. More complex care is performed by Dentists

### **HOW OFTEN CAN I USE THE SDS?**

Once enrolled, your child will receive a notice of offer every 12 or 24 Months according to their identified risk status.

Low Risk:

Children at **low-risk** of dental disease will be contacted every 24 months

**High Risk:** Children at high-risk will be contacted every 12 months

### **WHAT DOES IT COST?**

The service is free as well as Medicare Bulk Billing
