Hello, my name is Rapheal.

I am a boy from Uganda and I was born on 3 October 2010.
I live with my mum, dad, two brothers, grandfather and grandmother in a house made of mud brick with a grass thatch roof and a mud floor.
My mum and dad are both subsistence farmers.
When I grow up I would like to be a doctor.

My community

My community is in Eastern Uganda, near the centre of the country. Most of the adults in my community are involved in peasant farming, growing cassava, beans, maize and sweet potatoes, and raising cows, goats, sheep or pigs. As there is a lake nearby many adults and young people are involved in fishing. Most people live in houses with mud walls and grass-thatched roofs. My classes at school are very big, with up to 150 children per class, although most children only need to travel a few kilometres to get to school.

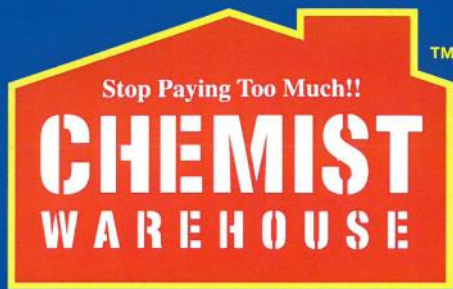
